Points of Distinction

- Each academic year, Pace has placed more than 300 School of Education students in internship and student teaching positions in K-12 settings in New York City, Westchester, Rockland, Putnam, and Orange counties.
- Our programs prepare our students to be successful on the New York State Certification exams. Our pass rates are between 98 and 99 percent.
- **The Pace High School provides a training ground** for Pace students and was listed in the top “10 Most Promising New High Schools” by *TimeOut New York*.
- Our faculty have received more than \$2 million in grants from the U.S. Department of Education, Verizon Thinkfinity, and other organizations to incorporate innovative use of video and Web 2.0 technologies in the classroom, the use of narrative education to enhance student engagement and learning, and inquiry-based learning in the classroom.

Robust Scholarships and Financial Aid

With an extensive financial aid program for students, we will work with you to make a Pace education affordable.

- **97%:** Percentage of first-year students who received scholarship or some type of financial aid
- **\$277 million:** Amount of aid Pace students received last year
- **\$17,846:** The average amount of institutional aid offered to all new undergraduate admits
- **\$4,000-\$28,500:** Range of merit-based awards

Financial assistance can come from many places, including scholarships, grants, on-campus employment, and loans. Our goal is to offer every student as much financial assistance as possible. University-sponsored scholarships are awarded to students on the basis of academic merit, service to the community, and financial need. Merit-based aid is based on SAT scores, high school GPA, extracurricular activities, and other factors. Need-based aid is based on academic qualifications and demonstrated financial need.

To apply, complete the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**. Consideration for funds is given on a first-come, first-served basis, so students are encouraged to submit applications before **February 15**.
