Directed and produced by Frederick Rendina and Oren Rudavsky
In 2000, 110 million children in the world were not in school—two thirds of them were girls. Ten years later, the filmmakers traveled to Nepal and Uganda, two countries emerging from conflict and struggling with poverty, to find the answer to one question: What does it take to educate a girl?
