

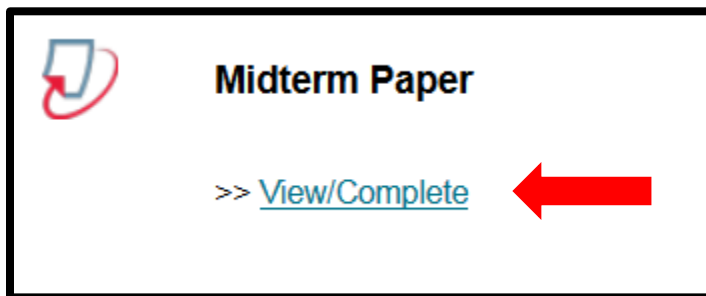

SUBMITTING A TURNITIN ASSIGNMENT

1. Locate the Turnitin assignment within your class's Blackboard course. Select **View/Complete**.



2. This will bring you to a new page. Under **Author**, select **your name** from the dropdown menu. Then, type in the **title** of your submission.
