Foreign Language	None. English is the language of instruction.
GPA	2.8
Visas	Visas are required. For US citizens the cost is approx. \$600 including permission to work up to 20 hours per week. Students may stay in Australia 30 days after the program ends. Class Standing	Students can study abroad as early as the first semester of their sophomore year.
