- The Pforzheimer Honors College for exceptional students **offers honors courses, events, and research opportunities in addition to a scholarship of at least \$15,000 per year.**
- Our special Business Honors Program offers every student **advanced seminars and workshops, executive mentoring, and international field study opportunities.**

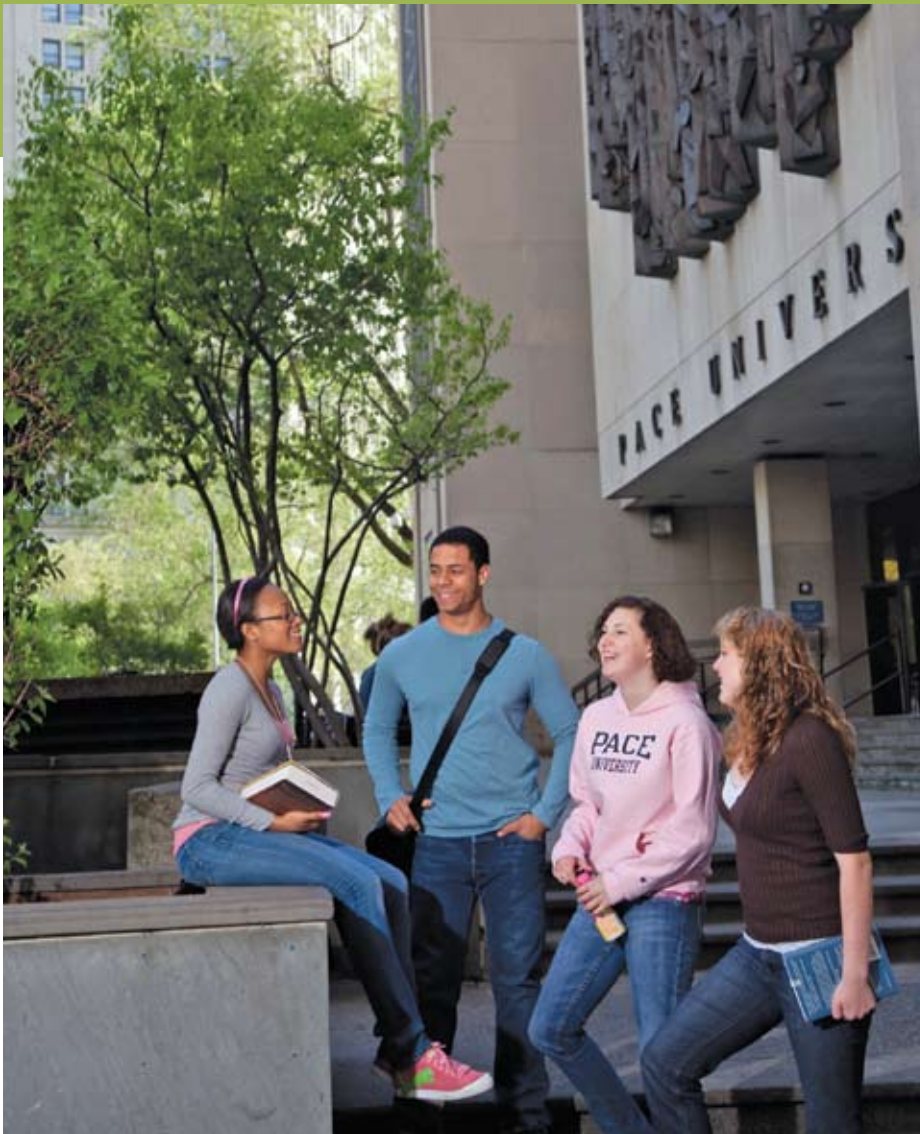

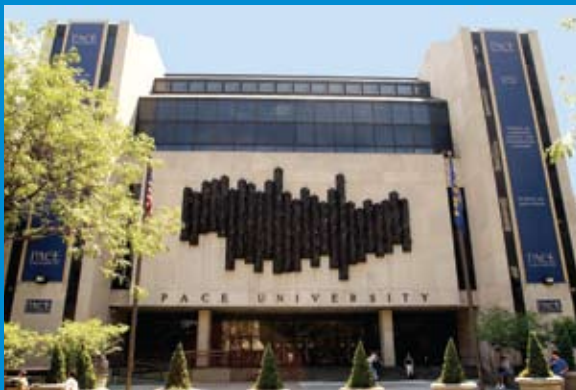
