A101 Guide to Applying for Scholarships to Study Abroad

(compiled by Professor Adrienne Kapstein, 2020; updated 2021)

- Most Scholarships will require an essay of some sort—write what you know. You
 are passionate about creating theater and sharing that with people. Use your
 passion to help craft a strong essay.
- Let people read it. Get feedback; write several drafts.
 Utilize the Writing Center at Pace.
- Look for scholarships that want to support *you* for *you*. There are many scholarships and awards out there supporting excellence in minority groups, LGBTQIA students, children of veterans etc.
- Cast a wide net by applying to multiple funding sources. Don't put all your eggs in one basket.
- Look beyond scholarships for students. There's a lot of money out there for *young artists* too.
- THIS IS HARDWORK! Some students make great efforts when applying for grant money, whereas others do not submit a single scholarship application. Remember that people want to give you this money. Thousands of dollars a year don't get awarded because people don't apply for it, BUT you must fill out the applications to the best of your ability if you want to be eligible!
- The lists below are extensive (although not exhaustive). It takes time and effort to find the right scholarships for which to apply.
