

Joint Admissions Agreement

Pace University, Pleasantville and New York, New York

And

Suffolk County Community College, Selden, New York

Effective October 30, 2020

This Joint Admissions Agreement ("Agreement") is between **Pace University** (the "University"), a New York State not-for-profit education corporation, an institution of higher education formed and existing under the New York Education Law, and **Suffolk County Community College** (the "College") formed and existing under the State of New York Education Law, an institution of higher education, and is dated this __30__ day of October, 2020.

WHEREAS, Suffolk County Community College desires to provide for the preferential transfer admission of well-qualified Suffolk County Community College graduates to Pace University, and

WHEREAS, in support of its academic mission, Pace University desires to accept as transfer students such well-qualified Suffolk County Community College enrollees; and

WHEREAS, the College and the University wish to collaborate to ensure degree completion and to facilitate the transfer process through information sessions and recruitment efforts;

WHEREAS, the intent of this Agreement is to facilitate the smooth transfer and transition of Suffolk County Community College students to the University, and

WHEREAS, the successful implementation of the Agreement depends upon communication of its contents to all involved participants, and assumption of responsibility by both institutions for such communication.

NOW, THEREFORE, Suffolk County Community College and Pace University, in recognition of the mutual covenants contained in this Agreement and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and adequacy of which are hereby acknowledged, do agree as follows:

A. General Terms and Conditions:

1. **Term.** The Term of this Agreement shall commence on October 30, 2020, shall continue for two (2) years, and, subject to paragraph 2 of this Section and the Termination paragraph of Section E, shall thereafter automatically renew July 1 on a biennial basis.

2. **Biennial Review/Modifications.** This Agreement shall be reviewed by both institutions on a biennial basis. No modification or amendment to the Agreement shall be permitted except upon the mutual written consent of the parties.

3. Pace and Suffolk County Community College jointly agree to provide the following:

a. Publicize the Joint Admissions Program internally and externally. Each school must approve any information or statements about the program, whether published only in one institution's materials (including admissions information, student bulletins, course guides, etc.) or otherwise.

b. Each institution shall designate a coordinator and an academic advisor for the Joint Admissions Program

c. Each party warrants that it shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national or ethnic origin, religion, age, gender, sex, marital status, disability or any other protected class in referring, advising or directing students in connection with this Agreement.

3. Admission:

The Joint Admissions Program is open to:

a. Applicants to College who shall be first-time matriculated freshmen; or

b. Transfer applicants to Suffolk who shall enter with fewer than 24 credits of completed college work, except students who were previously matriculated at Pace University; or

c. Any current matriculated College student who applies to the Joint Admissions Program prior to the completion of 24 credits of college work. This Agreement applies only to College students who have successfully graduated from the College with an Associate of Arts/Associate of Science Degree and designed Associate Applied Science degrees prior to enrollment at the University. Such persons shall be accepted to the University based on the following criteria:

Guaranteed Acceptance at the University shall be granted in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth herein below to students who complete the Associate of Arts/ Associate of Science Degree with a minimum SCCC Grade Point Average of 2.50 at the College. Such persons shall transfer to the University with junior standing.

B. The University shall:

1. Review all applications from Suffolk County Community College students to ensure that the recommended curricular map has been met. Provided the recommended curricular map has been fulfilled, and the student has graduated with the required grade point average and has met all admission criteria, admission shall be granted to the student. Suffolk County Community College students who are unable to satisfy an admission requirement may be considered by the University on a case by case basis.

2. Designate a contact from the Office of Undergraduate Admission for Suffolk County Community College students transferring to the University.

3. Conduct an orientation and registration program specific for Suffolk County Community College students transferring to the University.

4. Provide regular, on-site information sessions on the Suffolk County Community College's campus for students interested in transferring to the University.

5. Have faculty continue to work with Suffolk County Community College's Office of Academic Affairs.

6. Provide eligible students transferring to the University with academic scholarships upon their acceptance. If you are a new transfer student who meets our transfer admission criteria, as outlined above,

and has earned or are scheduled to earn an Associate Degree, the most updated transfer [scholarship eligibility requirements](https://www.pace.edu/admissions-aid/undergraduate-admissions/transfer/transfer-scholarships) are available at <https://www.pace.edu/admissions-aid/undergraduate-admissions/transfer/transfer-scholarships>.

C. Suffolk County Community College shall:

1. Publicize this Agreement to students, faculty and professional staff in campus publications.
2. Have advisors and counselors inform interested students of this opportunity.
3. Obtain consent from the students jointly admitted into the degree programs affiliated with this agreement in order to provide a list of graduates upon request.
4. Provide a list of majors upon request.
5. Organize a "Pace Day" for students to meet with advisors on the Suffolk County Community College campus. This event shall include meeting with Pace advisors, either on the Suffolk County Community College campus, Pace campus or virtually.
6. Assure that brochures and other printed materials are distributed to its transfer office, advisement center and academic departments.
7. Advertise any special programs or events the University is offering on the Suffolk County Community College's campus.

D. Transfer Guidelines:

1. Acceptance of Credits

(a) All courses in the transferring College student's degree major as to which such student passed shall be applied toward the completion of the articulated bachelor's degree major programs. (See Appendix for articulated programs)

(b) A maximum of **68** credits shall be applied toward the completion of the articulated bachelor's degree programs.

(c) If a given credit or credits do not count for requirements in the major, they shall then count as elective credit toward the degree.

(d) By virtue of completion of the A.A. or A.S. degree at the College, all students shall be deemed to have waived the lower level general education/core requirements at the University. Such students shall not be required to take any additional lower level general education/core requirements. Such waiver applies to all accepted students, regardless of whether a program to program equivalency exists. The exception to this statement is PACE: ENG 201 *Writing in the Disciplines*, a computing foundation course, and the Foreign Language Requirement (<https://pace.smartcatalogiq.com/2017-2018/Undergraduate-Catalog/Academic/University-Core-Curriculum/Second-Language-Proficiency-Policy>)

(e) Transferring College students with an A.A.S. degree may have additional lower level general education/core requirements at the receiving institution.

(f) The University and Suffolk County Community College also shall meet from time to time to identify any difficulties in the program, evaluate course sequence and content to facilitate transfers with minimal academic disruptions, and update the Transfer Guidelines, with particular attention to course

equivalencies (i.e. Suffolk County Community College classes for which students shall receive University credits). The University reserves the right in its academic discretion to modify or amend programs, as it would with its four-year students, whenever it deems appropriate. *The University shall communicate such modifications or amendments to Suffolk County Community College as soon as possible.*

2. Matriculation

Matriculation at the University shall be guaranteed with the possibility of deferred enrollment, as long as the student maintains the minimum academic requirements identified for their affiliated Pace academic program.

To facilitate the transfer of the College graduates to the University, the parties agree to ensure that students shall receive full consideration for financial aid upon matriculation at the University, provided they complete the financial aid process and meet required deadlines.

E. Both Parties agree:

1. **Confidentiality.** During the course of performance of this Agreement, either party (the "Receiving Party") may be given access to information that relates to the other party's (the "Disclosing Party") past, present and future research, development, business activities, products, services, technical knowledge and personally identifiable student and employee information. All such information shall be deemed to be "Confidential Information" unless otherwise indicated by the Disclosing Party in writing at or after the time of disclosure. Receiving Party may use the Confidential Information only in connection with the specific duties authorized pursuant to this Agreement. The terms of this Section shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, it is acknowledged by the University that the College is subject to the New York State Freedom of Information Law, as set forth in Public Officers Law, Article 6, which mandates public access to government records. Each party hereby acknowledges and agrees that the other party shall have the obligation to disclose only such information as is required by law and that any such disclosure shall be limited to the extent that the disclosing party considers proper under the law. If either party is directed or ordered to provide or disclose any information or matter by public authority or otherwise required to do so by law, such party shall promptly notify the party whose information is being provided or disclosed.
2. Neither party is authorized to use or distribute the other institution's logo and/or name for marketing in any form, including, but not limited to translate versions of materials, without prior review and written approval by the other institution.
3. **Termination.** Following the initial term set forth in Section A(1), this Agreement shall automatically renew on a biennial basis on July 1 unless terminated by either party in accordance with the provisions in this paragraph. Either party may terminate the Agreement at any time by written notice not fewer than sixty (60) days in advance of the renewal date. It is understood that no such termination shall take effect until the end of the academic semester in which such cancellation occurs. It is further understood that such termination does not apply to students already accepted to the University under the terms of this Agreement, even though not yet enrolled.

4. Compliance with Laws. Each party warrants on its behalf and that of its contractors, employees, and agents that it shall comply with all applicable Federal, New York State, and local laws, ordinances, rules, regulations, and codes.
5. No Employment Relationship Created. It is understood and agreed between the parties that this Agreement is not intended to nor does it create an employment contract between the University, on the one hand, and the College and/or any of the College's employees, on the other, nor does it create a joint relationship or partnership between the parties hereto. The parties' relationship is solely and exclusively that of independent contractor. Except as specifically permitted in this Agreement, neither party shall use the name or trademarks of the other party or incur any obligation or expense for or on behalf of the other party without the other party's prior written consent in each instance.
6. Cooperation. The parties agree to cooperate with each other in connection with any internal investigations by the University or by the College of possible violation of their respective policies and procedures and any third party litigation, except that the University shall not be required to have any contact with any Union or Union representatives of the College's employees or subcontractors or participate in any Union grievance or other proceedings relative to the College's employees or subcontractors except as a fact witness.
7. Force Majeure. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Agreement, neither party shall not be liable, nor shall any credit or other remedy be extended, for such party's failure, in whole or in part, to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement where such failure arises from or in connection with causes reasonably beyond such party's control, including, but not limited to, acts of God, flood, extreme weather, fire or other natural calamity, terrorist attack, any law, order, or regulation or action of any governmental entity or civil or military authority, power or utility failure, cable cuts, unavailability of rights-of-way, national emergencies, riots, wars, strikes, lock-outs, work stoppages or other labor difficulties, or pandemics, epidemics, or other global health emergencies (each a "Force Majeure Event"). If a Force Majeure Event occurs during the term hereof, the materially adversely-affected party (ies) shall be excused from performance hereunder for the duration of the Force Majeure Event.
8. Severability. If a court holds any provision of this Agreement to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect and the parties shall amend this Agreement to give effect to the stricken clause to the maximum extent possible.
9. No Third Party Beneficiary Rights. This Agreement is not intended to and shall not be construed to give any third party any interest or rights (including, without limitation, any third party beneficiary rights) with respect to or in connection with any agreement or provision contained herein or contemplated hereby, except as otherwise expressly provided for in this Agreement.
10. No Waiver. Failure of either party to enforce any of its rights hereunder shall not constitute a waiver of such right(s) or of any other rights and shall not be construed as a waiver or

relinquishment of any such provisions, rights, or remedies; rather, the same shall remain in full force and effect.

11. Governing Law and Jurisdiction. Except as may be preempted by federal law, this Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of New York, without regard to its choice of law principles. Litigation of all disputes between the parties arising from or in connection with the Agreement shall be conducted in a court of appropriate jurisdiction in the Borough of Manhattan, City of New York.

Appendix B: **College/Pace University Articulation Agreement Fact Sheet**

Guaranteed Transfer Criteria:

Students who are graduating from College with an Associate of Science/Arts are eligible for the College/Pace University Articulation leading to a Bachelor of Science/Arts in the appropriate programs at the University.

In this program, students who complete their College Associate Degree with a cumulative grade point average of 2.50 (or better) are guaranteed admission to Pace University.

Standard Program:

Upon enrollment at Pace, students from College who are admitted to the appropriate programs bearing the Associate Degree of Science/Arts are eligible to receive financial aid, based upon financial need and/or academic merit, on the same basis of any Pace University student. Students must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA must be completed and submitted to the Federal Government by the predetermined deadlines outlined by the United States Department of Education.

Transfer students from College are eligible for scholarships and grants based upon availability. More information regarding available grants and scholarships can be found on Pace University's website at <https://www.pace.edu/financial-aid/types-financial-aid/scholarships-grants>.

In addition to institutionally funded aid, students may qualify for need-based awards. Pace administers all Federal and State financial aid programs.

Cooperative and Education Career Services:

Upon enrollment, transfer students are eligible to participate in programs and activities offered by Cooperative Education and Career Services. These include (but are not limited to) the Campus Interview Program for graduating students, career counseling, access to job search access, and the Cooperative Education Program.
