Here's how you can utilize Degree Works to continue your success at Pace University:

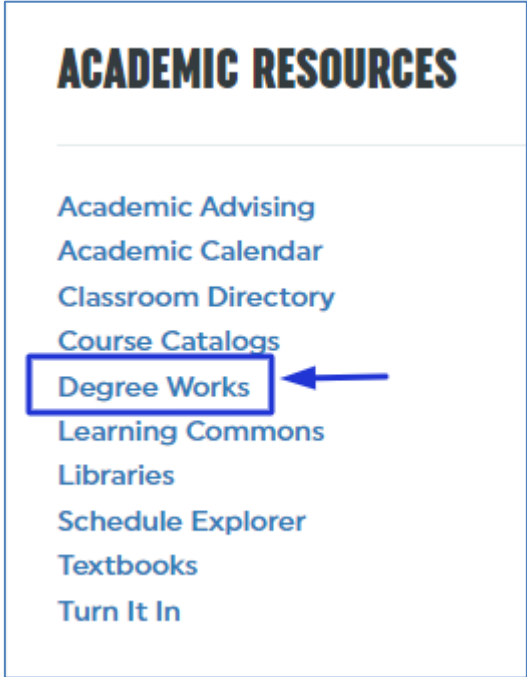
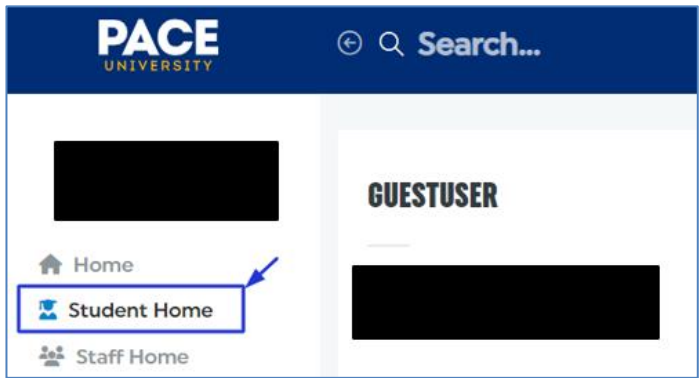
- ✓ Track all requirements necessary to receive your degree based on the term you entered the University.

- ✓ Use the GPA Calculators to estimate your overall GPA at the end of the semester or determine which grades are necessary to achieve a desired GPA.

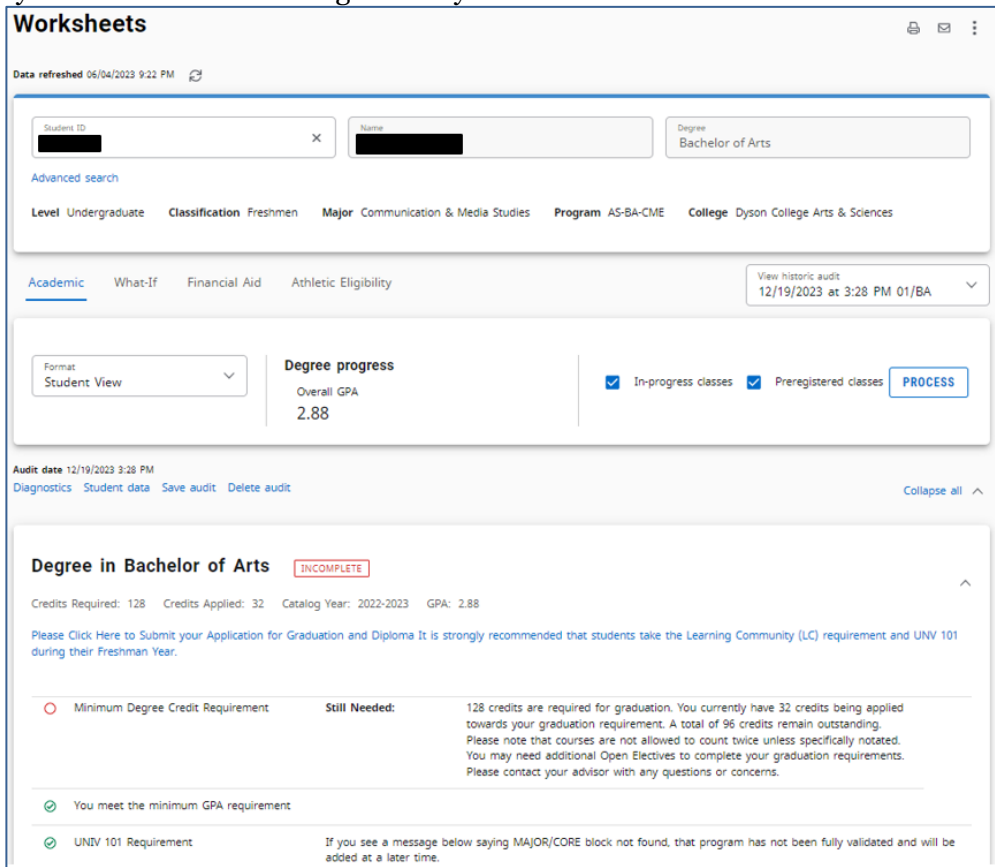
Log In Instructions for Degree Works

Log on to Pace Portal. Select the “Student Home” option from the left-hand panel. Under “Academic Resources,” select “Degree Works.”









Click the “Degree Works” link to launch the application.

Degree Audit: Student View

The Degree Report presents a student's academic history and data against requirements for the specific program they are enrolled in. It is imperative that students promptly submit a [Change of Major or Program Form](#) when switching programs so that Degree Works is presenting the correct information.

The first set of data presented is the student's information under the header *Student View*. This includes their name, UID, classification (Class Standing), advisor on file, overall university GPA, level of study, degree type, college, major(s), minor(s), and student Pace email.

Each section of the degree audit has a header bar that contains pertinent information about that section of the audit.

Degree Audit: Degree Section

The degree section of a Degree Works audit lays out all the individual requirements for the degree the student is attempting to earn. This would include Minimum GPA, Core Curriculum, Areas of Knowledge, Major Requirements, Minor Requirements (if applicable), and Learning Community/Writing Enhanced Course (only for non-transfer students).

The header for the Degree section contains the student's Catalog Year, how many credits are required for the degree and how many credits are being applied, as well as the student's overall GPA. Please be aware that students are held to the requirements of their program based on their Catalog Year, which is the year/term they entered Pace University. Programs can change from year to year, so please be cognizant of your academic year and speak to your advisors if you have any questions.



Viewing Previous Degree Audits


Periodically, a student's degree report may be saved (or frozen) electronically on Degree Works by their advisor, a faculty member, or the Office of the Registrar. A saved/frozen report may show a previous major or minor and is a snapshot of your academic progress when it was saved/frozen. To view these saved or frozen degree reports, follow these directions.

Step 1: Click on the *View History Audit* on the right side of the screen.

Step 2: Click on the drop menu labeled *View historic audit* and choose the date of the report you wish to view. Then press the *View* button.



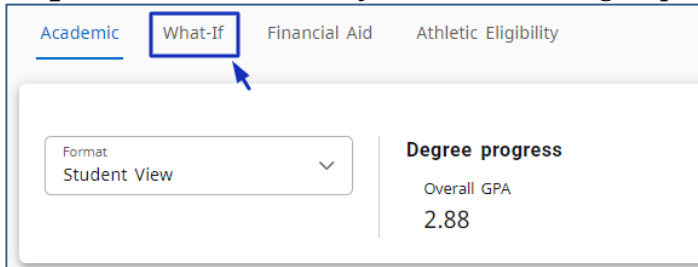

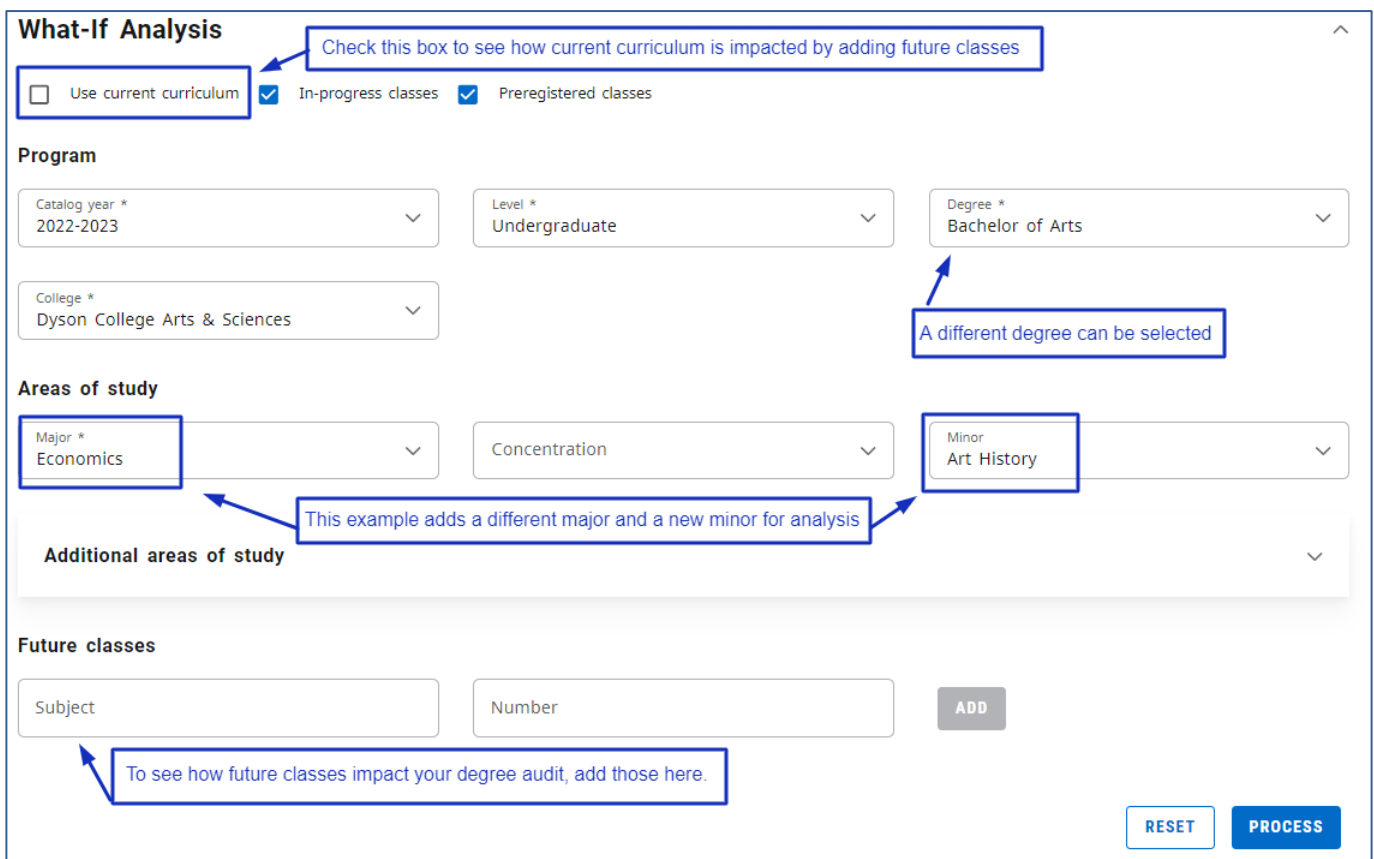
What-If Reports

Degree Works offers a function that allows the theoretical placement of courses into a student's degree report to see what requirements these courses fulfill and where they fall within the degree report.

Step 1: Click on the *What-If* tab above the Degree progress section.



Step 2: The What-If Analysis allows students to explore theoretical changes to their degree. Programs, Areas of Study, or Future classes can be selected to see how these will impact a student's time at Pace. In this example, a different major and minor are selected to determine the impact on a student's path to graduation.



Final Step: Once you are satisfied with the selections, click the **Process** button to generate the What-If audit.

Additional Note: Courses added in the Look Ahead report are noted as “PLAN” in the Grade column and in the Term column as “Planned Term.”

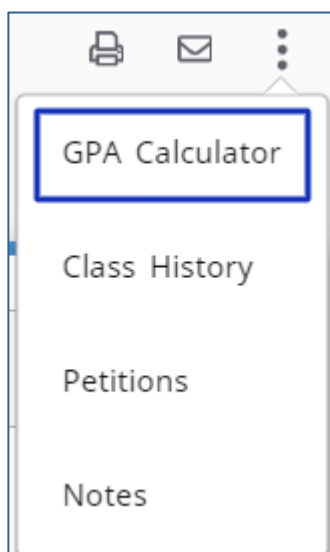

GPA Calculator

Degree Works offers a *GPA Calculator* tool that enables students and advisors to see what type of academic progress is required to reach a certain GPA goal. There are three different GPA calculators: *Graduation Calculator*, *Term Calculator*, and *Advice Calculator*. To access the GPA tool, click on the More option and select GPA Calculator.



The screen that comes up by default is the *Graduation Calculator*. At the top it will show you the student's current GPA and how many credits they need to fulfill their degree and how many credits are required. Below is an option to enter a Desired GPA.

The information can be readjusted by pressing the *Recalculate* button (located to the bottom right). This will bring you back to the previous screen and you can follow the same instructions while adjusting the previous information.

The next GPA tool is the *Advice Calculator*. The student's current GPA and credits earned are generated automatically, however this information can be adjusted manually if needed. Once you enter the student's desired GPA press *Calculate*.
