- You will have access to a variety of on-campus workspaces, including individual carrels within the Law Library stacks, two reading rooms for research, reflection, and discussion, as well as other open study spaces across campus.
- You will also have access to online legal research databases, including Lexis and Westlaw. You may make use of the free Lexis printing available through the dedicated Lexis printers in the computer labs.
- You are welcome to attend all lectures—both in-person and virtual—as well as oncampus events. You will also be invited to all events hosted by the Office of Graduate Admissions.
- You may audit classes offered by the Law School with the permission of your faculty advisor and the instructor teaching the course.
