Pace University Resources

- In the event of a crisis abroad, you should first contact the on-site Resident Director of your study abroad program, or (if you're on a faculty-led program) contact the Pace Faculty member.
- You can also call Pace Security (staffed 24/7) and you will be rerouted to Education Abroad or other Pace University Staff who may be able to assist you.
- You may also make a report using Pace's [online reporting system](#).
- If an act of sexual misconduct occurs abroad, you are encouraged to contact local law enforcement in the host country to report the crime.
- In case of a medical emergency abroad, call the international emergency [insurance](#) provider who will help you locate a qualified health care provider, make appointments, and pay for services abroad.

Sexual Assault/Harassment

Pace University is committed to providing a safe environment for every member of its community and to ensuring that no student, faculty or staff member is excluded from participation in or denied the benefits of any University program or activity on the basis of sex.

Pace University's [Sex-Based Misconduct Policy and Procedure \(PDF\)](#) prohibits the following forms of Sex-Based Misconduct: sexual assault, sexual harassment, gender-based harassment, dating violence, domestic violence, sexual exploitation and stalking

Consent: Affirmative Consent is a knowing, voluntary and mutual decision among all participants to engage in sexual activity. Consent can be given by words or actions, as long as those words or actions create clear permission regarding willingness to engage in the sexual activity. Silence or lack of resistance, in and of itself, does not demonstrate consent. The definition of consent does not vary based upon a participant's sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or gender

Study Abroad & Title IX

Although the recently amended Title IX regulations do not apply to conduct abroad, Pace University policies prohibit the above-referenced conduct even if the conduct occurs off-campus and outside the United States. More details are available in the policy.
