Strong applicants have an interest in the range of activities conducted at the Counseling Center and a minimum of one training experience at a Counseling Center. The program emphasizes a multicultural perspective in all aspects of clinical and professional work and experience working with adults and interest in multicultural populations are preferred. Former clients of the Counseling Center are not considered for training in order to minimize dual role complications and potential conflicts of interest.</p> <p>Selection criteria are based broadly upon perceived goodness of fit between the internship's offerings and requirements and the candidate's qualifications, interests, and potential for benefiting from and contributing to the program.</p>
