Nothing has been decided – October is time for discussion

Renewal options – consider moving to Emblem at a cost decrease but at a different model

- HMO is community rated in network only plan
 - Future growth rate expected to be 7-8%
 - Not linked to our experience/claims
 - o PPO claims experience won't dive up the cost
- Reduces cost to both enrolled and the university
 - o HMO Enrollees see 30% reduction in premium
 - Drop in base cost to the University by millions
- PPO option at enrollee's cost, PPO cost not absorbed by non-PPO participants
 - Likely increase of 20-30% per year
- Presented university an opportunity to save millions in expense

Cigna – came in a minus 3% renewal

- Pros: Flexibility, Quality
- Cons: Cost based on our experience which is causing increase in cost above our revenue growth

Cigna emailed Matt today – minus 7% for renewal Getting close to where we need to be to match the emblem option

Making modifications to PPO plan – changing copays and coinsurance amounts

HMO – in network plan – have to go to a Primary care doctor and get a referral for any specialist

PPO – open access – no referral needed and allows out-of-network at a greater cost but the option exist

Emblem presence – 86% for providers 90% of hospitals no issues with NJ and CT

- \$40 copay for all providers
