- Achievement. Prepare to pass your licensure exams through rigorous training. During the first half of 2017, Pace earned a 97.7% pass rate on the NCLEX-RN exam, significantly higher than the 84% New York State average and the 87.8% national average.
- Interprofessional. Nursing students collaborate with social workers, case managers, and a variety of paraprofessionals in the clinical setting. Communication sciences and disorders students work with the on-site Speech and Hearing Center and Ongoing Academic and Social Instructional Support (OASIS) Program for students with autism and related challenges.
