**ACHIEVEMENT.** Prepare to pass your licensure exams through rigorous training. During the first half of 2018, Pace earned a **93.8% pass rate** on the NCLEX-RN exam, significantly higher than the 89.4% New York State average and the 91.7% national average.

**INTERPROFESSIONAL.** Nursing students collaborate with social workers, case managers, and a variety of paraprofessionals in the clinical setting. Communication sciences and disorders students work with the on-site Speech and Hearing Center and Ongoing Academic and Social Instructional Support (OASIS) Program for students with autism and related challenges.
