PACE STUDENTS' WORLD PREMIERE

In our April 9 issue, we reported on the students at Pace University who produced a documentary about the hurricane recovery efforts in Puerto Rico. Now, that film has had its world premiere – a sold-out event at the Jacob Burns Film Center in Pleasantville on May 1.
